A safety management system (SMS) is a program for promoting safety and reducing risk to employees at work. It is implemented by an organization to identify, assess, and control hazards to employees and the public. Effective safety management systems prevent injuries, process failures, and improve long-term profitability of the companies that implement them. Whether you want to build safety into your business from the ground up or just want to improve processes that have been in place this session will introduce the framework of a safety management system and how it lays out the safety responsibilities for each level of the organization.
